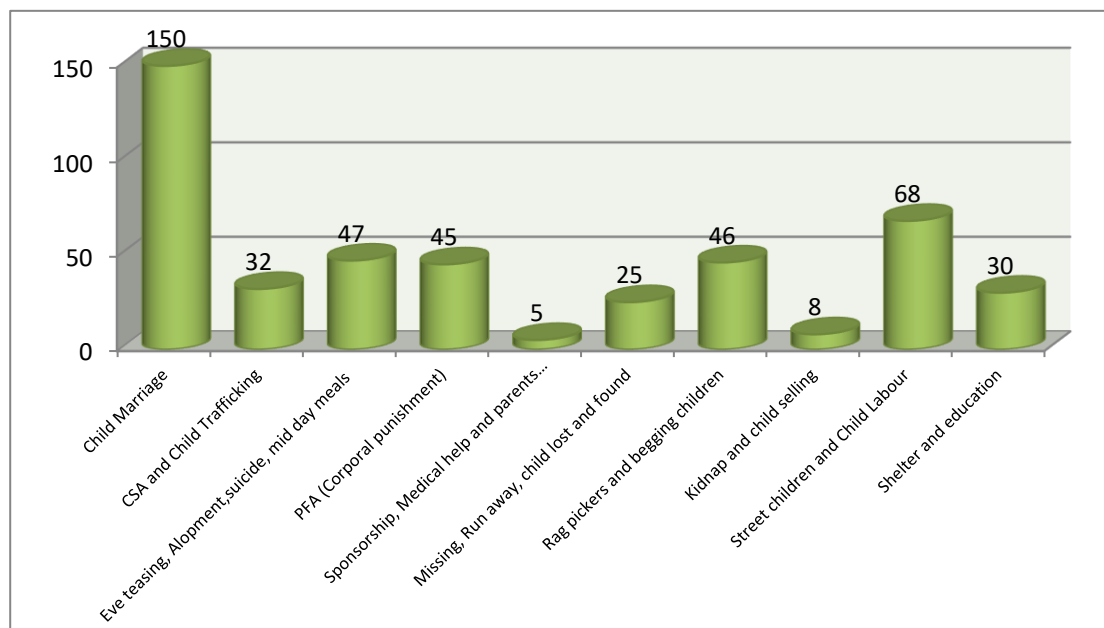

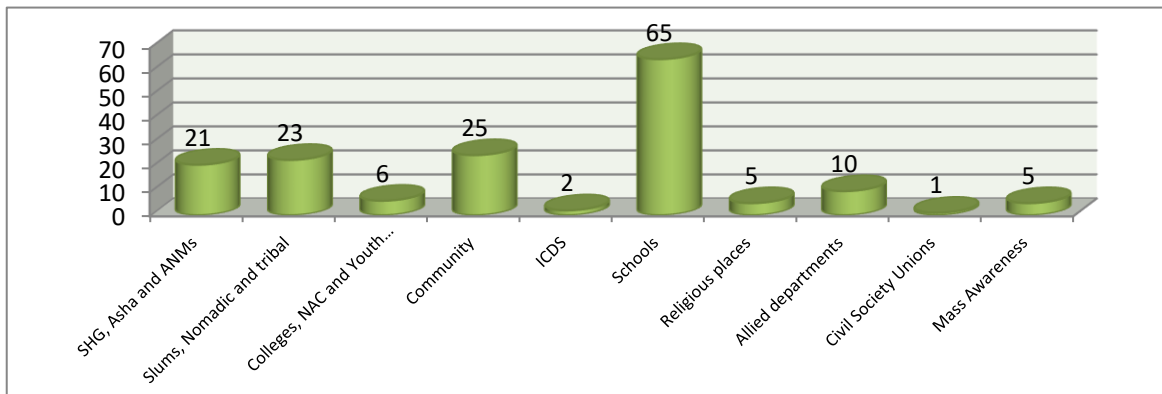

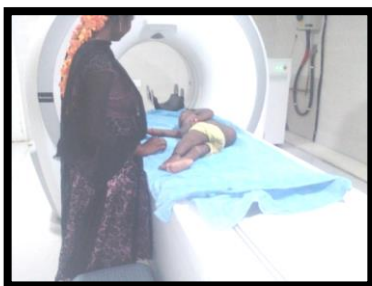
**Case study of medical help**

**Name of the Child:** Rishika. **Age:** 11 Months.  
**Caste:** -SC (Madiga)

On 12<sup>th</sup> March 2019 CHILDLINE team got the information of a child who was sick and needed urgent medical attention. The team went to child’s home and found the child is suffering with a large tumour on the back bone.

Family background: The mother of the child is an innocent lady. Father works as day labourer. They are very poor financially. So they requested CHILDLINE to support them to do medical process.

Action taken by CHILDLINE: The team reached the hospital and discussed with Dr. K. Pradeep (Paediatrician) about child. He has gone through the reports and advised to get MRI



scan report and referred to “DOLPHIN” hospital. On advice from the doctor, the child was taken to the hospital; CHILDLINE team explained the situation of the child and her family background. Dr. Mamatha does the scan for free of cost with kind heart.

On 13<sup>th</sup> March Dr. Prathap Reddy observed the child’s MRI Scan report which revealed that the tumour was spreading rapidly and the necessity of surgery. He also explained about the problems arises. Team member counselled the parents and relatives. Finally they agreed to go for the surgery. Then doctors advised to get the report of CT Scan KHIMS hospital done the scan for free of cost). After they gone through all the reports, decided to do surgery on 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2019. But the Surgery was completed on 9<sup>th</sup> April

CHILDLINE team produced the parents before CWC, submitted Xerox copies of all the medical reports. The bench gave the orders to CHILDLINE to follow up all the process.

“We hope that operation will be successful, and the child led the normal life “



**Case study of CHILD LABOUR**

**Name of the Child:** Group of children

**Age:** 10 to 17 years **Caste:** - Not available

**Information of case:** On 17<sup>th</sup> July 2019 GRP, Khammam got an information from Super indent of Police, GRP Secunderabad division about the children who have been trafficked by named "Raja Khan", As soon as they got the information, They informed to RPF, Khammam. Mr. Madhusudhan Circle Inspector of RPF Khammam informed to CHILDLINE and asked to involve in the rescue process. Mr. Srinivas and team of CHILDLINE immediately rushed to the place attended Navjeevan Express and deboarded the children and adults combined with GRP and RPF Khammam.



**Situation of the children:** Children at the railway station khammam all those children and adults were from Bhalagat district Madhya Pradesh state. They are all (adults 30 and children 29 (girls-13, boys-16)) worked 14 hours per day at Mango juice e processing factory which is near to Jholar pet, Tamilnadu state. From there the 29 children were travelling in Navjeevan express without their parents, in addition to the minor boys and girls 30 adults also travelling with them who belong to the same place. CHILDLINE team provided food for them and counselled them. GRP filed FIR under JJ Act (case no: 91/19U/S2/14 with 31 JJ Act).

**Action Taken:** Immediately CHILDLINE team produced the children before Child Welfare Committee (CWC). Mr. M. L. Prasad chairperson and the members of the committee told CHILDLINE to place the boys in Urban Residential School (URS) and girls at children home for girls. CWC also issued ordered to URS and children home in charges to provide temporary shelter, Mr. Vinod Kumar, the Secretary District Legal Service Authority (DLSA), Madhusudhan Circle inspector RPF visited URS and children home at 9:30 pm, interacted with the children, understood the situation of the children. Immediately Secretary DLSA instructed 2 police constables to escort the children in URS. Circle Inspector of RPF informed about the children to Mr. RV Karnan, the



Honourable district collector. He immediately instructed DM & HO to provide them health check-ups and submit the report. The next day on 18th July 2019 Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK) team, medical and health department conducted health check-ups for 16 boys at URS and 13 girls at children home and submitted the health report to honourable district collector. The district collector Khammam explained the issue and the present status of the children to the district Collector of Bhalagat district, Madhya Pradesh. The district collector, DLSA Secretary, ITDA PO Mr. Gowtham IAS, DWO, DCPO & CHILDLINE team visited URS, children home. Interacted with children and assured them that they



will be send to their home. District Collector and secretary DLSA interacted with the rescue team (GRP, RPF and CHILDLINE) and got the complete details of the children. The district collector informed that the arrangements were made to the children to stay at URS for boys and children home for girls till 21st July 2019. CHILDLINE team and DCPU team interacted with children and counselled them individually, collected all the ID proofs of the children (Aadhaar cards). The children were provided emotional support by the team.

The district collector instructed District Welfare e Officer (DWO) to make necessary arrangements for the travel of children and escort team with the coordination of DLSA, GRP, RPF and CHILDLINE. After the directions given by District Collector Mr. RV Karnan, arrangements were made to send the children back to their native places in "Balakot" area in Madhya Pradesh. Necessary escort arrangements were made with a team. The escort team consists of 17 members, 13 from Police department, 2 from GRP, 1 from DCPU and 1 from CHILDLINE



On 21st July 2019 Mr. Madhusudhan RPF CI arranged a special railway coach for the transportation of the children and escort team in Andaman express. Mr. Vinod Kumar DLSA secretary, Mrs. Vishnu Vandhana DCPO and Mr. Srinivas Coordinator CHILDLINE interacted with the children before they boarded the train, advised them to study well and also informed that arrangements have been made for their education at their native place. All the children and team went to Bhopal, the team handed over the children to CWC Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh for further necessary action to handover the children to their parents as per the instructions of CWC, Khammam.



On 22 July with escort of 17 team members sent back them to Bhopol, and produced them before bench of CWC, handed over to CWC for further needful action.

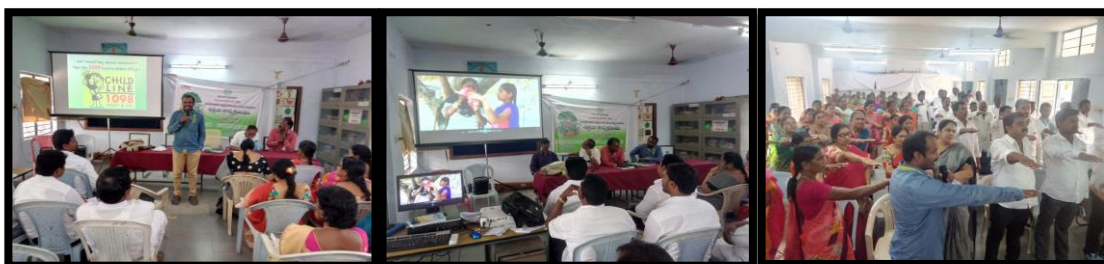
